Brush cutter



1. Instructions for using a brush cutter

Preparation:

- Read the user manual provided by the manufacturer.
- Wear personal protective equipment (PPE):
- Helmet or visor
- Safety glasses
- Gloves
- Cut-resistant pants
- Safety shoes
- Hearing protection

Checks before starting:

- Check that the cutting head, housing, and handles are securely fastened.
- Make sure that the oil (for 4-stroke engines) and gasoline levels are adequate.
- Check the condition of the wire or blade (replace if worn or damaged).
- Make sure there are no loose screws.

Starting:

• Place the brush cutter on a flat, stable, and clean surface.

- Start the engine away from people or animals.
- Let the engine run for a few moments before starting work.

Use:

- Hold the machine firmly with both hands.
- Work from left to right (for right-handed users).
- Do not force the machine; let it cut at its own pace.
- Always work with the engine behind you and the cutting head in front of you.

End of use:

- Stop the engine and wait for the cutting head to come to a complete stop.
- Clean the machine (filter, housing, cutting head).
- Store the brush cutter in a dry place, out of reach of children.

2. Safety instructions

General instructions:

- Do not use the brush cutter while wearing sandals, shorts, or loose clothing.
- Do not use indoors or in enclosed spaces (toxic exhaust fumes).
- Do not work under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or sedatives.

Safety during use:

- Keep people at least 15 meters away.
- Never remove safety devices.
- Always stop the engine before making adjustments or repairs.
- Never point the cutting head at anyone else.

Maintenance and storage:

- Never repair a damaged blade—replace it.
- Wait for the engine to cool before refueling.
- Store in a well-ventilated area, away from heat sources.
